

Greater Pinellas Point

St. Petersburg, Florida



Nestled at the southernmost tip of the City of St. Petersburg, in Pinellas County, FL, the Greater Pinellas Point neighborhood is surrounded on three sides by the sparkling waters of Tampa Bay. Our neighborhood is defined by eight parks, totaling more than 140 acres of green space, nine boat ramps, two recreation centers, a neighborhood pool, sports facilities, and access to some of the best fishing in the Tampa Bay region. We are proud of our amazing waterfront vistas, such as the panoramic view of the iconic Sunshine Skyway Bridge.

Our community boasts some of the greatest recreational resources with pristine waterways and facilities:

Maximo Park with 70 acres of wilderness areas, covered playgrounds, a beach boat ramps, disc golf picnicking and fishing. **Native Indians first lived in this area** and portions of their villages remain. Throughout the park you will find educational signage, where you can learn more about Maximo Park's history and archaeology. Some of these signs feature paintings, by **local artist Hermann Trappman**, depicting the natural history of the area.



Lake Vista Park 40.8 acres with a Playground, a recreation center, play camp site, outdoor pool, outdoor fitness zone, 2 basketball courts and baseball fields. The park also contain 8 tennis courts, a dog park, skate park and exercise trail.



Bay Vista Park has 4.3 Acres a playground, a recreation center, 2 boat ramps, restrooms and kayak racks.



The general public may rent Maximo Park land & shelters.

The general public may rent Lake Vista Park land & shelters, Lake Vista Recreation Center & Lake Vista Pool facilities and Athletic Fields.

Preserves and wildernesses:

Boyd Hill Nature Preserve is a nearby 245-acre award-winning park with 6 miles of trails & boardwalks. The park contains Unique ecosystems: such as hardwood hammocks; sand pine scrub; pine flatwoods; willow marsh; swamp woodlands and lake shore.

Boyd Hill is part of the Great Florida Birding Trail and has a bird of prey aviary, guided tours, group rentals, overnight camping facilities picnic areas & shelter. They also have a playground And gift shop. They also take part in the annual butterfly count with the North American Butterfly Association.

Boyd Hill Nature Preserve is a valuable resource and very nearby. It is one of the treasures of Saint Petersburg.



Formerly named Lake Maggiore Park, the preserve was renamed Boyd Hill Nature Trail in 1958 after a park superintendent whose dream was to bring together the people of an urban community and nature-in-the-raw without disturbing the balance of either.

Forrest Bluff Park has 9 Acres of wilderness area and a great place to relax.

Besides the schools listed there are a number of pre-schools, after-schools and day cares within the neighborhood.



For 2018, the neighborhood population consisted of 17,116 people. The anticipated 6.5% growth through to 2023 will bring it to 17,851. The number of households in 2018 were 7,526 with an expected increase to 7,824.

2018 Housing Units




Housing Units Expected by 2023




Median home values for 2018 were \$ 207,890 with a projected 2023 median of \$ 239,450. Other consists of seasonal and un-occupied units.


The median age in 2018 was 42.3 years old with a female to male ration of 1.3 to 1. The projected growth is minimal through to 2023 as far as median age and sex ratio of around 1%.



We live in a very diverse neighborhood with the majority of the population being Black, White and Hispanic.. The community also includes Native Americans, Asian and Mixed races.




Educationally our neighborhood boasts 91.5% of our neighbors 25+ have a High School diploma or greater. Of these 42.2% are college educated.



95.1% of the population 16 and up are employed. The unemployment rate for our area is 4.9%
